### NO PLACE LIKE HOME

Providence Park opened on April 14, 2011, in front of a sold-out crowd in the Timbers first-ever home match as an MLS team. The club proceeded to sell out all of its regular-season home games in the team's first six MLS seasons.

Spanning the 2013 and 2014 seasons, the Timbers compiled an MLS-club record 22-game unbeaten streak (12-0-10) at Providence Park from April 6, 2013 to June 1, 2014. The streak ranks as the third-longest all-time in MLS history.

### HEAD COACH GIOVANNI SAVARESE

Entering his first season with the club after being named head coach on Dec. 18, 2017, Savarese, the third head coach in Portland's MLS history, brings over 25 years of professional experience as a player and coach to the Timbers organization.



A native of Caracas, Venezuela, Savarese joined the Timbers after spending the past five seasons as the head coach and sporting director of the New York Cosmos, where he developed one of the most successful clubs in the NASL, compiling a 65-26-44 record in 135 regular-season games, including a career-best 20-7-5 record in 2016 and an undefeated NASL Spring Season in 2015. Additionally, the Cosmos scored 223 goals during Savarese's five seasons at the helm, which rank as the most in the NASL during that stretch. Savarese also led the Cosmos to four Soccer Bowl appearances, claiming the 2013, 2015 and 2016 championships. Most recently, after a 10-7-15 record in the 2017 regular season, Savarese guided the Cosmos to their third straight appearance in the NASL championship match, narrowly falling 2-0 to the San Francisco Deltas.

Prior to joining the Cosmos organization, Savarese, who holds a USSF "A" license, served as the head of youth development for the New York MetroStars/Red Bulls from 2005-2007, before joining the Cosmos as the club's academy director in 2010, with a focus on developing youth talent in the greater New York area. Savarese served as the Cosmos academy director for two years before being announced as the head coach of the first Cosmos team in 28 years on November 19, 2012.

Savarese enjoyed an 18-year professional playing career, including five seasons in Major League Soccer, scoring 159 goals in 322 games played in various leagues in the United States, Venezuela, Italy and England. At the international level, Savarese earned 30 caps for the Venezuela National Team from 1989-2001, scoring 10 goals, including a notable finish against South American rival Argentina in 1996.

After beginning his professional career in Venezuela with Deportivo Italia in 1986, Savarese spent five seasons (1990-95) playing in the Cosmopolitan Soccer League and the USISL before being drafted by the MetroStars in the inaugural MLS SuperDraft in 1996 as the ninth overall selection, notching a team-record 41 goals and 94 points in 85 regular-season appearances during three seasons with the club. The striker's record stood until 2009 when it was surpassed by Juan Pablo Angel.

Following his three seasons with the MetroStars, Savarese spent the 1999 MLS campaign with the New England Revolution, scoring 10 goals in 27 appearances. Shortly afterward, Savarese joined Italian Serie A club A.C. Perugia and was loaned to A.S. Viterbese in 2000, before returning stateside to join the San Jose Earthquakes in the 2000 MLS season. After a brief stint with the Earthquakes, Savarese joined Swansea City where he scored 14 goals across all competitions, prior to signing with Millwall F.C. in 2001. Following short spells with Venezuelan club Deportivo Italchacao and Italian club Sassari Torres, Savarese's playing career concluded in 2004 after scoring five goals in 10 appearances with the Long Island Rough Riders.

In the collegiate ranks, Savarese enjoyed a four-year (1990-93) playing career with Long Island University after moving to the United States from Venezuela in 1990. Savarese has also served as a member of the media, working as an analyst for ESPN International and ESPN Deportes.

Giovanni and his wife, Michelle, have two daughters, Valentina and Alessandra.

### ALL-TIME SERIES NOTES

Sunday's match marks the 19th regular-season meeting between the Timbers and the Galaxy since the start of the 2011 season. Heading into Sunday's match, the Timbers are currently riding a two-game winning streak against the Galaxy, outscoring LA 4-1 over both matches in 2017. Additionally, at the StubHub Center, the Timbers are unbeaten in their last two games against the Galaxy, dating back to Oct. 18, 2015. In the only meeting between the two teams at the StubHub Center in 2017, the Timbers picked up their first road win of the season, defeating the Galaxy 1-0 behind a Diego Chara finish.

### LAST TIME VS. LA GALAXY

Behind two-first half goals, the Portland Timbers defeated the LA Galaxy 3-1 before a sold-out crowd of 21,144 fans at Providence Park on Aug. 6, 2017.

# PORTLAND TIMBERS AT LA GALAXY

## SCOUTING LA GALAXY

Entering the 2018 campaign, the Galaxy have acquired 10 new players to start the season as head coach Sigi Schmid begins his first full season with the club after joining the Galaxy midway through the 2017 campaign. With Jermaine Jones and Gyasi Zardes departing the club, the Galaxy brought in notable signings such as midfielder Perry Kitchen and forward Ola Kamara. Kitchen, 26, joined the Galaxy after spending the past three seasons in Europe with Danish club Randers FC and Scottish club Hearts. In the last two seasons with Columbus Crew SC, Kamara scored 34 goals, including a MLS career-high 18 finishes in 2017.

## FACING THE GALAXY

The Timbers are unbeaten in their last two matches (2-0-0) played against the LA Galaxy, picking up consecutive wins against the California-based club in the 2017 MLS campaign. In their first road match of the 2017 season, the Timbers defeated the Galaxy 1-0 at the StubHub Center on March 12, with midfielder Diego Chara scoring the game-winning goal. In their only additional matchup in 2017, the Timbers picked up a 3-1 win against the Galaxy at Providence Park on Aug. 6, with forward Fanendo Adi, midfielder Diego Valeri and defender Alvas Powell each scoring in the victory. Additionally, the Timbers are unbeaten in their last three games (2-0-1) played at the StubHub Center, dating back to Oct. 18, 2015, outscoring the Galaxy 7-3 during that stretch.

## SEASON OPENERS

Since joining MLS in 2011, the Timbers have produced a 3-1-3 record in season-opening matches, winning their last two games to start the season. Most recently, in the 2017 regular-season opener, the Timbers produced a 5-1 victory over Minnesota United at Providence Park, with three different players scoring in the victory.

## SCORING IN SEASON OPENERS

In seven season-opening matches since joining MLS in 2011, the Timbers have recorded 13 total goals in the first game of the season. During that stretch, the Timbers have scored three or more goals on three occasions and have only been held scoreless once.

## EXTENDED ROAD TRIP

Due to the construction currently underway at Providence Park as part of phase one of the stadium expansion, the Timbers will play their first five league games on the road in 2018. During that stretch, Portland will travel 18,634 miles, facing the LA Galaxy, New York Red Bulls, FC Dallas, Chicago Fire and Orlando City SC.

## AWAY FORM

Dating back to the start of the 2014 MLS season, the Timbers have recorded the fourth-most away wins (19) in the league, recording seven away wins in 2014 and also in their 2015 championship-winning season. Additionally, in 2017, the Timbers were tied for the fourth-most away wins (4) in MLS.

## UPCOMING MILESTONES

With his next assist, midfielder Diego Valeri will rank second for assists in club history across all eras (since 1975). Valeri currently has 53 assists, ranking tied with Willie Anderson.

With a win in Sunday's match, the Timbers would record their third straight win against the Galaxy, dating back to the 2017 season, which would mark the team's longest winning streak against the Galaxy in Portland's MLS era.

## NEW TAM SIGNINGS

Utilizing Targeted Allocation, the Timbers made a number of key acquisitions during the offseason, acquiring defender Julio Cascante, midfielders Andy Polo and Cristhian Paredes and forward Samuel Armenteros.

A native of Puerto Limón, Costa Rica, Cascante, 24, joined Portland from Deportivo Saprissa with 107 professional appearances (93 starts) since making his debut in the Costa Rica Primera Division with Orión FC in 2011.

At 23 years old, Polo, who has 15 caps for the Peruvian National Team, joined the Timbers on loan after making 25 appearances with Liga MX side Monarcas Morelia in the 2017 campaign.

The youngest player to sign with the Timbers this offseason, Paredes, 19, joins the Timbers from Liga MX side Club América with over 30 professional appearances in his career as a central midfielder.

The newest addition to the Timbers' roster, Armenteros, 27, signed with Portland on loan from Serie A club Benevento Calcio after making 200 professional appearances in Europe.

## NEW LEADER AT THE HELM

Heading into the 2018 MLS regular season, the Timbers announced the club's third head coach in its MLS era, naming Giovanni Savarese as the new man in charge for the club's first team. A native of Caracas, Venezuela, Savarese joined the Timbers after spending the past five seasons as the head coach and sporting director of the New York Cosmos, where he developed one of the most successful clubs in the NASL, compiling a 65-26-44 record in 135 regular-season games, including a career-best 20-7-5 record in 2016 and an undefeated NASL Spring Season in 2015. Additionally, the Cosmos scored 223 goals during Savarese's five seasons at the helm, which rank as the most in the NASL during that stretch. Savarese also led the Cosmos to four Soccer Bowl appearances, claiming the 2013, 2015 and 2016 championships.

## REIGNING MVP

Midfielder Diego Valeri enters the 2018 MLS season as the reigning Landon Donovan MLS Most Valuable Player, after becoming the first Timbers player to receive MLS MVP honors following a record-setting 2017 campaign. Valeri's record-setting season was highlighted by a team-high 21 goals, a career-high for the midfielder, and a team-high 11 assists, marking the fourth time the midfielder has hit double digits in goals and assists in his five seasons in MLS.

## ATOP THE WESTERN CONFERENCE

The Timbers enter the new campaign after a successful 2017 season, with the team securing the No. 1 seed in the Western Conference for the second time in five seasons. Portland's 15 wins in 2017 also tied the club's MLS record for wins in a single season.
